Aim of Seminars:

• To explain the implications for home owners of the new 2013 Construction Regulations which came into effect on 1st of August this year.

Home owners are now required under these Regulations to appoint competent project supervisors when carrying out certain construction works.

- The requirements of the Safety Health and Welfare at Work (Construction) Regulations 2006 and amendments have been reviewed and updated. While the main focus of the Seminars will be on the new requirements on home owners, other changes under the regulations will also be highlighted.
- A workshop is included where participants will have the opportunity to prepare a Safety and Health Plan and decide on what information should be included in the Safety File.

Who should attend?

The seminars will be an invaluable source of information and guidance for anybody involved in the planning and building of a new house, house extensions or other home improvements. They should be of particular interest to home owners, small builders, sub-contractors such as roofers, electricians, plumbers, plasterers and block layers, as well as those involved in the design process such as architects, engineers, etc.
