Farming has been identified as an occupation with significant occupational health issues. For instance, a recent Teagasc/ H.S.A./UCD study indicates that almost 1 in every 10 of farmers suffer a musculoskeletal injury annually with over 80% of injury victims being unable to work for three days or more. This national seminar will outline the key findings of a 4-year Teagasc/ H.S.A./UCD Walsh Fellowship Study on Occupational Health aimed at improving the occupational health profile of the farming community.
