

What are the health and safety requirements for Tipper Trucks?

Required operator training:	FAS Safe Pass (for all construction site work including site deliveries) Site safety rules, site emergency procedures, etc. Safe tipping procedures and areas (practical and theoretical training should be given)
Mandatory safety devices:	Reversing alarms , Mirrors
